From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Lakeshore Church Family & Friends,

Sometimes in our lives bad things happen that we wish would not have occurred. Three weeks ago one of our good members came to Sunday morning worship. She hung her coat on the rack in the hallway as most of us do when we wear a coat on a rainy day, which it was. After worship she exited the sanctuary and went to retrieve her coat. It was not where she had hung it. She looked up and down the clothes rack, but did not see it. Where had it gone?

I have three ideas about what happened to the missing coat:

- 1. One of our church family mistook the overcoat for her own; she put it on, not realizing the coat was not hers. She took it home, hung it up and that's where it hangs to this day.
- 2. Someone not from our church walked in while we were in worship, saw the attractive coat, quickly took it off the hanger and left without anyone in worship seeing the thief.
- 3. An individual in worship saw the attractive coat knowing it was not theirs and intentionally took it home.

I tend to believe that the third option is the least likely, but it is possible. Lakeshore is not an ivory tower for saints, but a hospital for sinners. Jesus said, "The Son of Man came to seek out and save the lost." (Luke 19:10) While I would prefer not to consider the possibility of #3, it surely is possible. Each one of us is capable of sin any kind of sin. Pastor Roxie and I accepted the position of Executive Presbyter, overseeing 42 churches in central Nebraska in 1989. The former Executive Presbyter had been forced to vacate the position after he was convicted of molesting many young boys over 20+ years. I wish it weren't true, but sin is part of all of our lives, which is why we join with others in worship each Sunday to confess our "common sins" or "shared sins," then confess our personal sins in private prayer, and then hear the "Assurance of Pardon," God's forgiveness.

The reason we join together as Lakeshore Church is to experience a better quality life by hearing the truth: we all are sinners and Christ died to take our sin upon himself. As forgiven sinners we come into God's presence as God's children. As God's children we receive an inheritance - which includes eternal life. Our lives go better with God.

Many times through the years when I have lost something, it has turned up in the strangest weirdest places, which is unexplainable. When we had kids at home I blamed it on the kids, but now that we only have a cat at home many mysteries remain unexplainable.

If you look in your closet and see a dark button-down women's overcoat, please bring it to the church and hang it on the rack. It may be the lost overcoat! And the mystery of the lost coat will be unexplainable no longer. Together let us seek the will of God.

And you know what? He's that way for every one of us. (Nowhere in the Bible is there an asterisk with the note "Except for you".)




Fellowship


