When you were a child, did you receive a good Christian education? I did. In our home church in Dobbs Ferry, NY I had some wonderful Sunday School teachers who taught me about Jesus' love for me, and perhaps more importantly, shared their love for me. In the book of Timothy in the Bible Paul writes to young Timothy that he (Paul) remembers the sincere faith that lived in his grandmother Lois and in his mother Eunice. Often, we receive our earliest Christian education from our mothers and not so much from our fathers. Today the parents of young children may not know the stories in the Bible to share with them. The job of teaching Biblical truths to children has fallen to our churches, which: includes Lakeshore Church, and our Vacation Bible School.

This year Vacation Bible School, also known as, Space Adventure Week, runs through the last full week in August: 21-25. We are shooting for the stars and expecting 20 children. For the next 5 weeks in Worship, you will experience a lesson the children will learn in Vacation Bible School or Space Adventure Week. The purpose will be to excite our church family to invite family, friends and neighbors to try this year's Space Adventure Week.

This year we have leaders, professionally trained, who will use their training and experience to make this the best VBS we have seen in years. For example, Carole Cesefske has teaching credentials in music education, she will help lead singing; Kathryn Pennanen was a physical education teacher for decades, and Kathryn will lead the outside games; Janet Saxon, who has been involved in Christian Education at many churches, is the overall director of VBS; Steve Steinhaus, a professionally trained cook, will prepare the evening meal to be served at 5:30 each night.

The children will be in the middle of a space adventure while learning to **SHINE JESUS' LIGHT** when they:

- → Are Unhappy
- → Don't Get Along With Others
- → Feel Joy About Good Things
- → Feel Sad
- → See People Who Need Help

Through crafts, discussions, dramas, music and mementos to take home students will learn that Jesus is there for them.

Please invite any relatives and/or friends between 4 and 12 years of age to at least try this year's VBS, Monday, August 21 – Friday August 25 from 4-6 PM.

The excitement hung in the air when they arrived at the resort. The hills were bursting with people, sounds of laughter and brilliant snow all around.


