

To be honest I don't know how dire her situation is, just heard how tired and kinda defeated she sounded when she left a message earlier today saying she'd been taken somewhere for more care. I haven't gotten back to her yet because I figure she needs to rest.

I'm really hoping and praying that when I talk with her we'll be laughing again and this will just be a blip in her impressive life. (Please, God?) She's someone who knows as much about me as anyone can (and vice versa) in only about ten years. In spite of the PTSD and DID reactions and the times earlier in our relationship when I tried to push her away because of the attachment disorder issues, she not only never let me go, she's also always been accepting of me as I was in any phase of this healing journey. She's even frequently told me what a blessing I am for her!

I actually love it when I get to do anything for her because she's taught me how to love in a reciprocating way; that's been a 'Holy Grail' goal.

She's the person I laugh with the most, and it's always at ourselves.

At the beginning of the week we went to a solemn occasion.

What's unfortunate though is one of our greater sources of humor is MM is blind and I'm not the best 'leader person for the blind'. I appear to be capable of assisting in only one aspect when trying to guide her; either watching the ground so she doesn't trip, or keeping an eye on her other side so she doesn't run into solid surfaces.

On the way into the church she had to walk across grass, an uneven sidewalk, then up 7 or 8 steps and she never tripped. However, we then had to go through a narrow doorframe, down an aisle and through a second doorway. (uh-oh)

I have no idea how many times her left side hit a door frame or pew so we were trying not to laugh at my ineptitude, but after the umpteenth time I leaned down to (hopefully) quietly whisper in her ear, "I'll pay you a dollar for every bruise you end up with". She quickly responded with "Is that all you're paying me? Shouldn't it be more by now?" I couldn't keep the laughter completely suppressed any longer.

It was such a respectfully quiet, solemn room, and then there was us. I honestly expected someone to ask us to leave, and rightfully so.

.A couple of weeks ago I read something about if you have two or three people in your life who you can be your real self with, truly trust and can count on even when your back is turned, then you're richly blessed. I was in such a snarly, sniveling mood at the time I hard a time coming up with two - Mighty Mouse being one of them, of course.

Yesterday when I was writing a gratitude list, per usual MM was on it, and then was able to acknowledge 5 or 6 other people who fit the 'truly trustworthy friend' list.

It's the first time I've ever personally experienced the heart and soul healed and edifying: "My cup runneth over."
