Today is January 27, in 1945 on this day the Auschwitz Concentration Camp in Poland was liberated by the Russian army, and the remaining 7,000 prisoners who had not been killed by the Germans and their collaborators were set free. In total over six million Jews were murdered in Europe from 1938-1945. I ask myself, "How this could have happened in a country that was Christian with 54% identifying as Protestant and 40% as Catholic?" What I have read about those years in Germany is that most Christians at the time believed that what was best for the German nation was best for Christianity. When the Protestant and Catholic Churches cooperated with the government, they were treated well by the government. So they quietly went along. Government news sources told the people that Jews were dragging down the German economy, and that the Jews favored the Communists in Russia. The Nazi government forced as many Jews as possible to leave the country before WWII began, and once the war was in progress began to murder Jews first by shooting them, then by exterminating them in concentration camps, like the camp in Auschwitz. The Nazi government called this "The final solution." Some Christians in Germany opposed the government, such as Dietrich Bonhoffer, who was executed. The United States entered the European theatre of war on December 11, 1943. By May 8, 1945 Germany was fully occupied by Russia in the east and the Allies, including the United States from the west, and Germany surrendered. I thank all those who served our country in the armed forces and those who worked doubly hard on the home front to produce the weapons needed by our soldiers doing the fighting.

Could we Christians today be accomplices to the atrocities that occurred in WWII? I would like to think not. I would like to think that we would stand with Jesus regardless of the cost to us individually. Jesus was asked, 'Which commandment is the first of all?' 29 Jesus answered, 'The first is, "Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; 30 you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength." The second is this, "You shall love your neighbour as yourself." There is no other commandment greater than these." (Mark 12:28-31 I believe that by and large we do follow our Lord Jesus Christ.

I also believe that our freedom of the press would inform us if atrocities were being inflicted on any minority, and we would stand up if we felt our own government were acting contrary to the will of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.
