Lakeshore has about 60 active members. Normally a healthy church has 50% of its membership in worship on an average Sunday. That means that for Lakeshore to be a healthy church it would have about 30 in worship on an average Sunday. But Lakeshore averages about 44 in worship on any given Sunday. What is amazing is that on an average Sunday Lakeshore has about 32 members in worship and 12 nonmembers. Together members and nonmembers comprise the LAKESHORE CHURCH FAMILY! Membership in Lakeshore Church is for those who chose to receive Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior and chose to support Lakeshore with their time, talents and treasure.
