From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Lakeshore Church Family & Friends,

Numbers are important. On Pentecost Sunday (50 days after the resurrection of Jesus Christ) Peter informed the crowds in Jerusalem that Jesus, who had been crucified just 52 days previously, was both Lord and Messiah. The Bible says that those who heard Peter were "cut to the heart." They asked "What should we do? Peter said to them, 'Repent and be baptized, everyone of you in the name of Jesus Christ so that your sins may be forgiven and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.'" The Bible goes on to say that those who welcomed Peter's message were baptized, and about 3,000 persons were added that day. Numbers are important to God, and it is important to keep in mind that each of those 3,000 individuals was important to God and to the early church. God cares about each sparrow and God cares about each individual. "Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? And not one of them will fall to the ground without your Father's will. But even the hairs of your head are all numbered. Fear not, therefore; you are of more value than many sparrows." (Matthew 10:29-31) Each sparrow is important to God and each of us is important to God.

The number of people worshiping and serving God in Lakeshore Church is growing. For example this past Sunday, March 19th, we had 42 in worship, and last year we had 22. We had 13 in our 9:00 AM Adult Bible Study last Sunday and a year ago we had about 7. In our Fellowship time after worship we had 28 this past Sunday and about 20 last year. These numbers are important, but more important is each individual that these numbers represent.

Our purpose at Lakeshore Church is to enable each person who attends the Adult Bible Study, the worship service, or the Fellowship time to experience a better quality life because of their relationship to Jesus Christ and Lakeshore Church. They must know that they are important to us. They must know that we care about them. God cares about each of us. We love God. We love one another. From the time an individual walks through one of our doors, we need to show that we care about that individual. We do that by introducing ourselves and asking about how they learned about Lakeshore Church. When we show interest in anyone, we don't know, we let them know they are important to us. When someone worships with us, the Evangelism & Outreach Committee sends a card the same week, letting that person know that their presence in worship was appreciated. Pastor Bill follows up with a call or a card as well. We are servants of Jesus Christ sharing the love of Jesus Christ with every individual who walks through our doors. As they walk with Jesus Christ, their lives improve. Let us continue to warmly receive anyone who joins us for any activity, and the numbers will continue to be encouraging next year and well into the future. Jesus Christ is Head of Lakeshore Presbyterian Church! Thanks be to God!
